



# The Orpington Kennel

A walk in, covered kennel. The sleeping area has a central door with bed areas either side, accommodation for possibly two dogs. The sleeping section also has a flat top which can be removed for cleaning and gives the dogs a summer or daytime rest point.

### ORPINGTON KENNEL OPTIONS.

**WEATHER SHIELDS.** A set of boards that blank off one side wall and half the front wire. Offering extra protection from wind rain & sun. The shields can be transposed to the other walls so can be changed as often as the wind does.

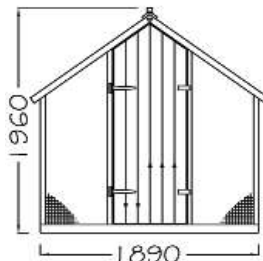
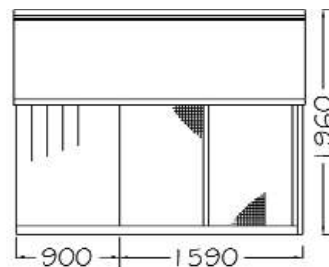
**EXTENSION RUN.** Gives nearly double the run area.

**FLOOR.** An 18mm floor on a 4x2 pressure treated frame, very strong & very heavy

**TREATER . FORSHAM WOODSEALER** is clear finish, which is animal safe and durable enough to be recommended for marine use

**STRETCHER HANDLES.** Four person lift.

**DOG BED** A thick foam pad with that can be cleaned by wiping, shaking, brushing or vacuuming and can even be hosed or pressure washed. The material used is much stronger than conventional pet fabrics and is impervious to dirt, mud, pet hair and flea larvae.



# The Goudhurst Goat Shed

The Goudhurst Goat Sheds are specifically designed for goats. They are heavily constructed on a 95x45 (4"x2") frame (some stables are 3"x2" or even 3 x 1 1/2"). Clad in 21mm thick shiplap boarding, all timbers are pressure treated. Internally the walls are lined to 4ft high with 9mm exterior grade ply. The roof is weathered with Onduline sheeting (black). The heavy stable door, constructed in 21mm thick tongue & grooved boards has a disproportionately higher bottom door to dissuade the goat from clambering over.

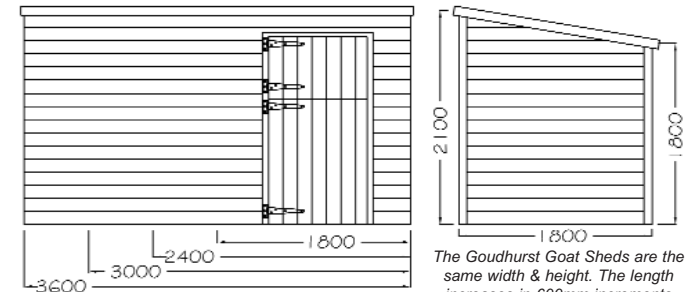
A fold away 'Goat Bunk' is built in (a second bunk is available as an option). When we kept\* goats they would always be looking to climb on something, anything to be 'king of the castle', (must be throw back to the old days in the mountains) in that respect the bunk panders to that 'play' need. On a more practical note it encourages them the sleep off the hard concrete (or damp mud).
